

Committee Structure & Responsibilities

- Conduct quarterly meetings normally via conference call
- Conduct 1 Face to Face meeting per year normally at the Annual Training Summit
- Develop and submit an annual work plan and budget request following the training summit meeting
- Can assign sub-committees for training assignments, equipment research, etc.
- Other duties and details that may be assigned by the elected executive board



MABAS Funding

MABAS receives:

- 2.5 million from Cook County through the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant
- 2.5 million from the State through the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) grant
- 1.0 million from the State through the Preparedness and Readiness (PAR) grant
- \$200,000 from the State through the State Fire Marshal grant, toward insurance costs
- Divisional Dues, a percentage based on Department/District budget
- The State will reimburse departments through MABAS for any IEMA taskings after disaster declarations



• These are rough numbers that change from year to year (mostly declining)
