Rescue Specialist Applicant Information

The MABAS - Illinois Urban Search and Rescue Team, Illinois Task Force 1 (IL-TF 1), is looking to fill current vacancies with highly qualified and detailed oriented individuals to serve as Rescue Specialists. Applicants for this position must be a member of a recognized fire agency or department. The preferred candidate will have completed NFPA 1006 Technician level training in the disciplines of confined space, rope, structural collapse, trench and vehicle and machinery rescue. Following the National Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) standard, IL-TF 1 has identified required, preferred and recommended training levels for candidates. In identifying these qualification levels, the training requirements for a deployable member on a statewide MABAS-Illinois Divisional Technical Rescue Team and the rescue certifications available through the Illinois Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) have been considered.

Minimum requirements for application:

- Valid Driver's License
- IS 100, 200, 700 and 800
- OSHA First Responders Operations Level for Hazardous Materials (OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120) -or- Illinois OSFM Hazardous Material Operations
- Current EMT-B (Basic) license (Note: EMT-P (Paramedic) meets this requirement)
- Firefighter II or Basic Operations Firefighter
- Rope Rescue Technician
- Confined Space Rescue Technician
- Trench Rescue Technician
- Structural Collapse Rescue Technician
- Vehicle & machinery Rescue Technician
- Explanation or description of any structural collapse operations experience which could include training, participation in exercises, real world incidents or deployments

(Note: Illinois OSFM certification is not needed to fulfill this requirement)

Preferred Training Levels:

A maximum of 20 points (1 point per course or qualification) will be awarded to candidates who have completed recommended training curriculum (see worksheet for a description of this curriculum).

Required application documents:

- Completed application with appropriate references
- Resume
- Qualification worksheet (including copies of certifications, licenses, course completion records and documentation for each of the required and preferred training courses in the sequence listed)
- A letter of endorsement from their Fire Chief for the position of Rescue Specialist

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Applicant processing information:

- Based on a review of the application and points awarded for completion of the preferred training curriculum, initial interviews will be scheduled for a minimum 30 individuals.
- A total of 100 points can be awarded as follows:
 - 20 points – Preferred Training Levels
 - 60 points – Oral Interview
 - 20 points – Manager's points
- An eligibility list of applicants will be established. A score of 70 points or better is required to be added to the list.
- The eligibility list is valid for a period of three years from the date it is established.
- Further participation in the selection process will take place as vacancies occur.
- Candidates selected for the initial interview will be required to bring in additional documents, including a current firefighter fitness for duty documentation. Individuals will be provided with this information when they are contacted for an interview.
- Following appointment, the new Rescue Specialist will be required to satisfy other general, position specific and team training requirements (as listed below in the National US&R training descriptions).
- Failure to complete the general and position specific training requirements is grounds for removal from the team.
- Failure to attend 50% of the scheduled team training activities is grounds for removal from the team.
- The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) identifies a 5-year commitment to the team.
- Newly appointed Rescue Specialists will be assigned to that position for 3 years. Any voluntary request to transfer to a different position will not be accepted in this timeframe.
- IL-TF 1 members can remain active members on any of their departments and MABAS division's Specialty Team(s).
- IL-TF 1 is a MABAS statewide deployable team. IL-TF 1 members cannot be listed on the statewide deployment roster for any other MABAS Specialty Team.
- Candidates may update their application file with additional rescue course completion records.
- Resolution of any discrepancies will be settled by the US&R Branch Chiefs

General Training Requirements:

Each individual participating on an Urban Search & Rescue Resource shall:

1. Complete Critical Incident Stress awareness training.
2. Complete IS-100, IS-200, IS-700 and IS-800B online training courses
3. Complete their jurisdictional US&R Response System/Team Orientation
4. Complete training at the First Responder Operations Level for Hazardous Materials (OSHA 29 CFR, 1910.120)
 - a. Complete annual refresher training as required for First Responder Operations Level for Hazardous Materials (OSHA 29 CFR, 1910.120).
5. Be currently certified in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (persons currently licensed or certified as EMT (all levels) and licensed Board-Certified Emergency Physicians inherently meet this requirement).
6. Complete respiratory protection training per OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134 (k)
 - a. Complete refresher training as required for respiratory protection training per OSHA 29
 - b. CFR 1910.134 (k)
 - c. Have successfully completed an annual quantitative respiratory protection fit test required per 29 CFR 1910.134 App. A
7. Complete NFPA 1670 Awareness Level training for:
 - a. Confined space rescue operations
 - b. Water rescue operations
 - c. Structural collapse operations
8. Complete Blood-borne Pathogen training in accordance with OSHA 29 CFR
9. US&R WMD Enhanced Operations course or equivalent
10. Complete GPS Awareness Level Training

RESCUE SPECIALIST POSITION DESCRIPTION

Functional Description:

The Rescue Specialist is responsible for performing the rescue function of the US&R Resource incident operation. The Rescue Specialist reports directly to the Rescue Squad Officer.

Description of Duties:

The Rescue Specialist is responsible for:

- Implementing technical skills and operating equipment necessary for completing the rescue portion of the action plan;
- Performing rescue operations under the direct supervision of a Rescue Squad Officer and providing periodic progress reports as needed;
- The operation and routine field maintenance of rescue tools and equipment;
- Ensuring accountability, maintenance, and minor repairs for all issued equipment;
- Evaluating and modifying rescue tactics as needed; and
- Performing additional tasks or duties as assigned.

Position Requirements and Criteria:

Individuals who meet the following requirements and criteria will be eligible to deploy as a Rescue Specialist in support of the US&R Resource's activities. The intent of these requirements is to select personnel fully capable of providing the rescue tactics and techniques required in various disaster environments.

Required Training:

The Rescue Specialist shall:

- Complete all of the required General Training requirements;
- Meet requirements of the latest edition of the NFPA 1006 Rescue Technician:
 - Rope Rescue Technician;
 - Confined Space Rescue Technician;
 - Trench Rescue Technician;
 - Vehicle and Machinery Technician; and
 - Complete refresher training as required by the AHJ in accordance with Rescue Technician (NFPA 1006);
- Complete the FEMA National US&R Response System Structural Collapse Specialist course, or equivalent; and
- Have a current Certification in Basic First Aid for First Responder, or equivalent.

Recommended Training:

The Rescue Specialist should:

- Complete Chapter 11: Surface Water Rescue.
